Communion Minister Training

New Ministers - St. John the Apostle in Brandenburg will host the 2 session Communion Minister Formation on Tuesdays, August 11 & August 18 from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. both nights. Communion Minister Formation is a two-session program for those preparing to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion in their parishes, as well as those who are presently serving in this role but have not attended this program in the past. Each 2-hour session will include the Theology of the Eucharist, Liturgical Ministry and the Practical Aspects of the Role of the Communion Minister. This formation program will fulfill the training portion of the canonical mandate required for Extraordinary Ministers.

Update Session - The Communion Minister Update Session is for those ministers needing a mandate renewal, who have already completed the archdiocesan two-session Communion Minister Formation Program. This session will fulfill the requirements for continuing formation for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. The next session will be on Monday, August 3, 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. at St. Margaret Mary, 7813 Shelbyville Road, Louisville, KY.

As part of this event, a catechesis (Love is Our Mission: the Family Full Alive) has been prepared that shows how Catholic teaching regarding sexuality, marriage, and family flows from our basic beliefs about Jesus. These weekly bulletin blurbs will summarize the 10 themes that form this catechesis, which show how love in a family is a summons to embody God's love in everyday life. Week #1, "Created for Joy" explains that human beings are more than an accident of evolution. God exists. God is good, and God loves us. God created us in His image to share in His joy, and God takes an active hand in our lives. God sent His son Jesus to restore our dignity and lead us home to Him. Week #2, "The Mission of Love," explains that God works through us. We are in the world for a purpose—to receive God's love and to show God's love to others. God seeks to heal a broken universe and asks us to be His witnesses and helpers in that work.
