## Lent Begins February 10

**Ash Wednesday** - Masses are 8:30 a.m. at St. Mary and 7:00 p.m. at St. Theresa

**Stations of the Cross** - Stations of the Cross will held on Fridays during Lent at 7:00 p.m. at both St. Mary and St. Theresa Churches.

**Penitential Services** - There will be a Lenten Penitential Services on Thursday, March 10 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Mary and on Thursday, March 17, at 7:00 p.m. at St. Theresa.

## Rules of Fast and Abstinence

**Abstinence** - All US Catholics age 14 and up are bound by the Law of Abstinence—abstaining from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all other Fridays during Lent.

**Fasting** - All US Catholics age 18 through 59 are bound by the Law of Fasting—One full meal per day, with 2 lighter meals to maintain strength. Days of Fast are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Excused from fast and abstinence (besides those outside the age limits) are those of unsound mind, the sick, the frail, pregnant or nursing women according to need for meat or nourishment, manual laborers according to need - and other circumstances that would seriously hinder us in carrying out our work.
