Archbishop Kurtz will be consecrating the Archdiocese of Louisville to the Immaculate Heart of Mary at the 66th Annual Living Rosary in celebration of the Fatima Centennial. This will take place Sunday, October 8, at

Trinity High School's Steinhauser Gymnasium, located at the corner of St. Matthew's Avenue and Shelbyville Road in Louisville. The Holy Name Band will play some hymns at 2:30 p.m. and the ceremonies being at 3 p.m. This consecration will dedicate the Archdiocese in a special way to the Blessed Mother who always leads us to her Son. To help us prepare beforehand and reflect on it afterwards, Archbishop Kurtz has written a letter that summarizes and presents a pastoral letter that his friend, Bishop Johnston, wrote about the notion of Consecration to Mary.
