Mowing Season



Please note during mowing season at both St. Mary and St Theresa Cemeteries, no benches, flower arrangements, statues, or any other objects are permitted on the ³ ground that will interfere with mowing or

weed-eating of the cemetery. Shepherds hooks are acceptable only if they are placed right next to the monument and the arrangements hanging on them don't interfere with mowing/weed-eating. Small statues or any other objects placed on the base of the monument must be glued to the base so they don't end up on the grounds. Please note with flower arrangements get blown off due to high winds, we have no way of knowing which grave they belong to.



The Archdiocese of Louisville is committed to ensuring that children and youth who worship, study or participate in church sponsored activities can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible. In an effort to fulfill this

commitment, all employees or volunteers who have contact with children or youth (18 and under) for ANY lengthy of time are required to participate in one of th

e 2-hour Safe Environment Training Workshops. At this time, the trainings are limited to 50 individuals. All trainings are first come/first served. No advance registration is necessary. The next scheduled are:
